#### **II. PROJECT REVIEW:**

#### The objectives:

Within the project support from August-October 2024,

- 1. A community self help group (SHG) which is formed by local rural family to help each other and sustain their living production.
- 2. 15 families, each of family will get a home privet sanitary toilet
- 3. 25 families will receive a 1800-liter concrete, water jar with roof guttering to collect rainwater:

#### Impression of the project beneficiaries:

Although this project funded is small amount but it is valued and greatly impacted on our rural population. It is meaning that we are participating with the initiative of the Royal Government of Cambodia that are putting efforts together to address the above issues by committing with United Nation (UN).

- 15 latrines were built and helped each other by group SHG members
- 24 water jars were installed for our rural SHG

A self help-group (SHG) was established:

A self help group is a group of local people voluntary join together, help, sharing, addressing local issues together. It is an effective way of local sustainable by helping, sharing or passing production locally. It is also a good model for next generation to learn how to sustain local consolidation.

For: example: They helped each other to sharing labors, help weakness local people or family by themselves:

Let say, a poor lady who very poor with chronic sickness, and handicap: she is very weak even not able to walk, no wheel chair and even difficult to clean her house,

As realized of this situation, a group member discussed that decided to help each other to clean and continue to keep helping locally, and help her on time.
